Everything You Wanted to Know About Cymbidiums — But Were Afraid to Ask

"I got hooked on orchids when I was approximately 10 years old. I read a Nero Wolfe mystery about a 300+ pound detective who lived in New York, never left his home, had a greenhouse on his roof and raised orchids. The descriptions of the orchids were fascinating and I could hardly wait to get my own home and raise orchids. For over 30 years, I have been growing orchids and they are just as fascinating now as when I was 10 years old.

Currently there are about 800-1000 plants in my collection. Most of the plants are cymbidiums, grown outside, but I do have a greenhouse for the assorted genera that prefer warmer growing conditions such as cymbidiums from India and Australia, Cattleyas and Miltonias.

While I am a judge with both the AOS and the CSA judging systems, and appreciate quality flowers of various genera, I still get a thrill of blooming a seedling for the first time, or seeing what that \$2 yard sale special looks like." - Trudy Hadler

P.S. The Nero Wolfe mysteries were fiction, but the greenhouse on the roof, filled with orchids is true.

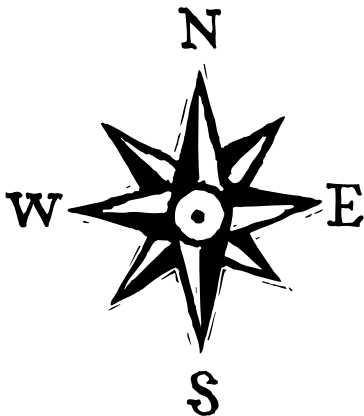

A NEW JUDGING CENTER IS COMING!

At the recent AOS Members Meeting in Santa Rosa, the Judging Committee and the Trustees approved the proposal for the California Sierra Nevada Judging Center, a separate judging site in Sacramento, CA. Having a judging center in Sacramento will better serve the orchid enthusiasts in the Central Valley of California and in the areas around Reno.

In recent years, there has been a population explosion in the Central Valley. With that growth, in our area, we have noticed the availability of orchids to the general public by national named stores. People are purchasing the plants but do not know what to do with them once the plant finishes blooming. We are excited that the Judging Committee and the Trustees have given us the assignment of getting the educational tools out to help those people and to help them get in contact with a Society in their area.

The judges of the center are looking forward to being a greater support to the local Societies not only in the Sacramento area but also in Chico, Reno, Stockton, Modesto and Fresno. We will have a lot of communication going on with our Societies to see how the center can best to serve them.

The members of the Societies supporting the new center are excited and several have expressed genuine interest in joining the American Orchid Society Judging System. We are grateful for their interest and are happy to have them join the judging system.

The support the new center received from our judging colleagues at Pacific Central Judging Center was exceptional. Their support and guidance to the people working on the proposal was a great help in getting the new center approved. We are delighted to hear that our friends from Pacific Central Judging Center will be joining us to judge in Sacramento.

The judges transferring to the new center are busy getting everything in order for our first judging on Wednesday, May 3. The judging in conjunction with the Sacramento Orchid Society meeting will be at Sierra II, Curtis Hall Building, 2791 24th Street, Sacramento.

MEMBER PROFILE: HAMILTON ORCHIDS & INTERIOR PLANTS

While at the San Francisco Orchid Expo, Garry and I stopped at the booth of Hamilton Orchids. We learned that they provide plant boarding. We invited SCOS member, Cris Hamilton, to write an article for the newsletter to let all the members know about their boarding services.

Leasing & Maintenance Programs — Orchids & Orchid Boarding

Hamilton Orchids and Interior Plants has been serving the San Francisco Bay Area since 1984. The business started out doing Interior Plantscaping.

According to Cris Hamilton, Owner, "We would add orchids as color spots from time to time. I joined the Marin Orchid Society in 1992 and

got into collecting and growing orchids. The Greenhouse that we have now is in Southern Petaluma and is a 17,000 sq. ft. computer climate controlled facility.

Our climate-controlled greenhouse allows us to closely monitor light, temperature, and humidity requirements for all orchid plants. We have several microclimates to suit each varieties individual need. We also board cymbidiums.

"We provide flexible pick up and delivery of orchids from our greenhouse to the orchid boarding customer. Our

service area includes Napa, Sonoma, Marin, San Francisco, the Peninsula down to Palo Alto, and the East Bay over to Walnut Creek."
